C.L.M. CIRCULAR NO. 1/1959

Application for land earmarked for Prospecting Permit

It sometimes happens that application for land are rejected because the area is under consideration for the grant of a Prospecting Permit, or a Prospecting Permit may actually exists over the area. This is correct but can lead to hardship if alater application who happens to apply after the prospecting Permit question is settled is successful. The earlier applicant may justly feel that he has been unfairly treated.

- 2. Application for land which is found tofall within an area earmark for Prospecting Permit should be registered and charted in pencil on the Standard Sheet in the normal way and the file K.I.V. 'd'. When the Prospecting Permit application is rejected or the Prospecting Permit finally expires without selection for Mining title, it will be observed when correcting the Standard Sheets that there are application outstanding in the area. All the files referred to should then be taken out and dealt with.
- 3. Applicants affected in this way should be sent a standard form af acknowledgement in Malaya as follows:-

I realise that this arrangement will have the effect on making the arrears position in land offices look worse than it is and it is much easier to reject application outright if they fall within areas earmarked for prospecting, but we should be prepared to make the extra efford and put up with any unjustified criticism on the subject of arrears which may follow as result, in the interests of fairness to the ordinary kampung applicant.
